#### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

##### General notes

##### Following inhalation

Irrigate copiously with clean, fresh water for at least 15 minutes, holding the eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

##### Following ingestion

Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Do NOT induce vomiting. In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical advice.

#### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling
